Terry Fox


In 1980, he began the Marathon of Hope, a cross-country run to raise money for cancer research. Fox initially hoped to raise \$1 million, then \$10 million, but later sought to raise \$1 for each of Canada's 24 million citizens. To date, his legacy has led to over \$850 million raised for cancer research and the run occurs in 60 countries.

This year's Terry Fox Run will be held on October 4 and everyone is also invited to participate in the community run on September 17 which matches the date all over Canada. T-shirts were designed with support from Ryan Reynolds and may be ordered online at <u>https://shop.terryfox.org/.</u>

Our school goal this year is to raise \$2500 which is approximately \$3 from each student and staff member. Of course, the more donations that we collect, the quicker we can get a cure for all types of cancer.

The research shows that Terry would've survived his cancer if he was diagnosed today. His dedication has helped many Canadians survive through the innovative research that the Terry Fox Foundation has funded over the last 43 years.
